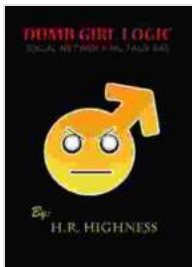

Using poor grammar and spelling on social media can make you look unprofessional and uneducated. It can also make it difficult for others to understand what you are trying to say.

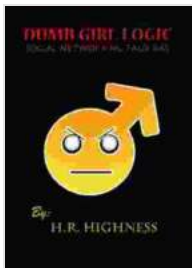

* Proofread your posts before you publish them * Use proper grammar and spelling * Avoid using slang or colloquialisms

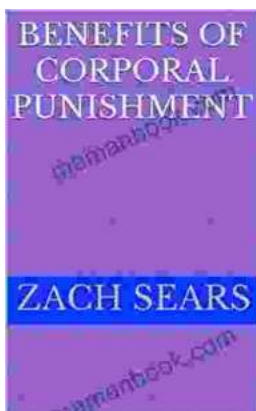
